3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "Support International

1 SEC. 2. STATEMENT OF POLICY.

2	It is the policy of the United States—
3	(1) to support the Investigation into the Situa-
4	tion in Ukraine being conducted by the International
5	Criminal Court (ICC), including by providing mate-
6	rial support and participating in international efforts
7	to collect and preserve evidence that may be relevant
8	for prosecution;
9	(2) in general and consistent with United
10	States foreign policy priorities, to provide material
11	and technical support including for the collection
12	and preservation of evidence to ICC investigations of
13	war crimes, crimes against humanity, genocide, or
14	crimes of aggression;
15	(3) to pursue a policy of constructive engage-
16	ment with the ICC; and
17	(4) to take steps required for the United States
18	to become a state party to the Rome Statute of the
19	International Criminal Court.
20	SEC. 3. REPEAL.
21	Section 7401(b) of title 22, United States Code, is
22	hereby repealed.
23	SEC. 4. REPORT REQUIRED.
24	Not later than 90 days after the date of the enact-
25	ment of this Act, the Secretary of State shall submit to
26	the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Rep-

1	resentatives and the Committee on Foreign Relations of
2	the Senate a report setting forth the Administration's pol-
3	icy review of the United States position on the Inter-
4	national Criminal Court's Investigation into the Situation
5	in Ukraine, including—
6	(1) recommendations as to the provision of ma-
7	terial support to such investigation; and
8	(2) the national security and foreign policy ben-
9	efits of formally providing material support to such
10	investigation and other investigations.
