3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

5	(a) PROCEDURES REQUIRED.—Not later than 180
6	days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-
7	retary of Defense shall establish procedures under which
8	the Secretary shall review and reinvestigate allegations of

9 civilian harm that—

- 10 (1) resulted from military operations involving
 11 the United States Armed Forces that were con12 ducted between 2011 and 2023; and
- 13 (2) the Secretary finds were likely incorrectly
 14 dismissed due to investigation errors or incomplete
 15 information.
- (b) CONSULTATION.—In establishing the procedures
 under subsection (a), the Secretary of Defense shall consult with nongovernmental organizations that focus on civilian harm and human rights.
- (c) POLICY UPDATES.—Not later than one year after
 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of
 Defense shall submit to the congressional defense committees a report that includes—
- 24 (1) a description of any errors identified during
 25 the review and re-investigation process required
 26 under subsection (a);

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1	(2) an identification of any revised credibility
2	assessments and new credibility findings;
3	(3) a description of steps taken in response to
4	new credibility findings, including any offers of ex
5	gratia payments; and
6	(4) recommended steps to prevent similar errors
7	in the future.
8	(d) Congressional Defense Committees.—In
9	this section, the term "congressional defense committees"
10	means—
11	(1) the Committee on Armed Services and the
12	Committee on Appropriations of the Senate; and
13	(2) the Committee on Armed Services and the
14	Committee on Appropriations of the House of Rep-
15	resentatives.
